Dee-light for Kiya as she takes School Games win

THREE Cheltenham Harriers were among more than 1300 athletes taking part across 10 different sports at the 2021 UK Schools Games in Loughborough.

Kiya Dee has gone from strength to strength this year since discovering a talent for the steeplechase and earned her first team selection at the event in Loughborough.

Despite having only competed in the event twice before Dee is the English Champion and therefore expectations were high going into the competition and she ran a superb race to pull clear of her rivals and take the win in 5:03.51.

Jessica Duncton was also taking on the 80m hurdles, holding on well in a close race to secure a bronze medal and cross the line in 11.62.

This is Duncton's third national medal of the season, she adds the bronze to her English Championship bronze and English Schools silver.

Sulaiman Ouiles has been having a fantastic season so far and the chance to compete in the pole vault was well deserved.

Ouiles performed well and held his own at his first major championship event to finish fourth with his fourth best jump ever, 3.55m.

In the final Youth Development League event of the season, Cheltenham Harriers' Under-17/Under-20s were third overall at Hereford.

Relays: Four of the six teams producing victories, two of which came from the Under-15 girls. Flora Hopcraft, Elinor Farrier, Annabelle Wigan and Cara Walsh won the 4x100m in 53.9 and Isobel Burfitt, Milly Foster, Georgia Howell and Ellis Woolley took the Under-15 4x300m in 3:12.8. The Under-13G team of Izzy Cook, Taylor Steele, Ava Mitchell and Charlotte Smith enjoyed a 4x100m victory in 55.8. In the boys relays Oliver Fowler, Othniel Harris, James Keenan and Oliver Belbeck combined in the Under-15 4x100m to win in 50.6. The 4x300m team of Charlie Mason, Freddie Coombe, Tom Gavin and

Sam Wilson finished second, but were disqualified. The Under-13 4x100m team of Caleb Green, Fred Buckland, Bertie Travis and Benjamin Parker were second in 60.6.

Under-20: Alastair Klemz impressively navigated around the track in the 100m and 200m events, coming third in both races, missing out by 0.06 and 0.11 seconds respectively. Tom Samuel and Alfie Wood competed in the long jump winning the A and B event. Samuel equalled his PB with 6.64 and Wood jumped a best of 6.55. Grace Pitman won the 100m with her second quickest time of the year 12.9 and then took second in the 200m in her third quickest time ever, 26.6. Pitman made a rare appearance on the field jumping 4.55 for second in the long jump. In the shot, Lily Carpenter won by more than two metres and improved her PB by 41cm throwing 10.36 and moved into the top 40 in the UK rankings. The 4x100m team consisting of Tamsin Hatton (Under-17), Ruby Brook (Under-17), Lily Marchant (Under-17) and Pitman flew around the track to win in 52.0.

Under-17: Oliver Spencer, Philip Hunt and Marchant took part in the 100m and 200m. Spencer was third in the A 100m in 11.7 and second in the A 200m in 23.9. Meanwhile, Hunt

ran a 100m PB in the B race of 12.7 and was 0.01 behind his PB in the B 200m, running 26.5 for third. Marchant ran a 100m PB of 13.1 for third and a 200m SB of 26.9 to win the B race. Brook took on the A 200m running a PB of 26.2 to win. In her main event, the 300m, Brook made it two victories crossing the line in 41.8. Hatton ran well in the B 300m coming second in 48.4. Freya Howell was the sole 800m competitor and came second in 2:38.1. Isaac Henderson battled hard in the 3000m and missed out on first place by 0.6 but was rewarded with his second quickest time, 9:10.0. Molly Dibden took victory in the 3000m running 12:31.7. In the field, Ruben Lombard threw a huge javelin PB improving his previous best by six metres, a throw of 51.44 moving up to 21st in the UK rankings. Luca Colombini won the B competition with a best of 42.29 and Oliver Risborough threw 37.71 as a guest. Mimi Davis took second place in the javelin with 35.46. The discus saw Billy Buxton finish third with 25.78 and Hatton threw a shot put PB of 7.91 for 4th. Celia Darwent jumped superbly to clear a SB and =PB of 1.45 in the high jump claiming second place. There were A and B string victories in the pole vault with Sulaiman Ouiles clearing 3.65 in the A event and Bexley Turbard jumping 2.75 in the B competition.
